3-yard line, Bailey and Tristain Warren got a touchdown saving tackle and caused him to fumble.

The half-time show started with the Bears leading 20-7.

Second half was a great opener by the Bears defensive linemen. Jose Hernandez and Adam Dingler stopped the Wildcats on their first possession, while Dillon Croley allowed no gain on second down. Jones and McDonald then forced Palestine to punt. Charlie Stringer then scrambled around, blocked the punt and Brownsboro had the ball again.

Into the third quarter, on Brownsboro's first play, Croley made a direct snap to runningback Cameron Warren but only gained 4-yards. Two plays later, Edgar came in and faked the punt but was also unable to gain much yardage.

On third and goal, Brownsboro scored their fourth TD of the game with 4:29 left in the third. Owens faked a handoff to the left and then threw right, 5-yards to Johnson. Ryan Smith's kick was good and the Bears left Palestine behind at 27-7.

It was at this time, Palestine's quarterback Olin Terry was already out of the game and in a left arm sling. The Wildcats switched quarterbacks several different times between Olin Terry, Michael Smith and Coby Anderson. Timeout injury after timeout injury, Palestine would continue to suffer. The Wildcats did not score again for the remainder of the game.

Keith Johnson scored again with approximately one-minute left in the third quarter. Wide open in the endzone, Johnson caught a 20-yard touchdown pass from Owens. Smith's kick was successful and the score 34-7, Brownsboro.

Later in the fourth quarter, Bear Dustin Edgar struck three more points on a field goal and the game ended 37-7.

The Bears now have a current record of (1-2), (5-3).

Ryan Owens was 12 of 19 passes for a total of 219-yards and 2-touchdowns.

Keith Johnson dominated on Bears receiving with 7 catches for 162-yards and 2-TD's.

Cameron Warren led the Bears in rushing with 119-yards.

**Pageant set for
Nov. 15 in Murchison**

The Today's Girl Youth Organization will hold a preliminary pageant in Murchison on Saturday, November 15, 2008, at Murchison ISD cafetorium. Girls between the ages of 0 and 18 are invited to compete in six different age divisions. Girls who are awarded a title in the local preliminary will be eligible to attend the Texas State Today's Girl Finals, to be held in June at the Southfork Hotel in Plano. The national finals will be held in late July.

In conjunction with the pageant, the girls will collect teddy bears for "Teddy Bears for Troopers." The bears are distributed throughout the state and placed into the Texas State Troopers' patrol cars for use in crisis situations. Teddy Bears for Troopers has collected over 1,200 bears for troopers and other police organizations.

The competition divisions include Today's Baby (0-3), Today's Doll (4-6), Today's Miss (7-9), Today's Junior (10-12), Today's Teen (13-15), and Today's Girl (16-18). Girls compete in party dress/evening gown, casual wear, interview, beauty, and talent, not to exceed three minutes. The younger age divisions through age 6 are not required to present a talent. Participants can enter the beauty competition only if they have not yet developed a performance talent.

All participants in the Today's Girl Youth Organization are required to complete 8 hours of community service

work each year. Today's Girl is a certifying organization for the President's Volunteer Service Award. Girls who perform at least 50 hours of community service activity are awarded the bronze award, and a silver and gold award is also available at various activity levels. Today's Girls logged over 10,800 volunteer hours during the 2006-2007 competition year.

Today's Girl is a program for young ladies that provides guidance for the development of tomorrow's leaders. Our goal is to offer a positive environment which allows girls to develop poise, self-confidence and character. The Today's Girl Organization encourages a familial atmosphere and our participants are active in their communities, perform at various events and enjoy making new friends. Today's Girl is a scholarship-based program which encourages the development of talent, academic achievement, and awareness of the need to improve their social environment through community service. Over \$5,000 in educational scholarships were awarded last year.
