ing, and the other was from Attorney Jim Lambeth on the year end report on delinquent tax collections. No action was taken on either item.

Next up were items for setting dates and times for certain board events. One such item was for a public hearing on district and campus AEIS results, which the board set for January 12 at 7pm. Fulgham made the motion and Wise seconded.

After this, the board set the date and time for Superintendent Caldwell's performance evaluation; January 13, also at 7pm. Ridgle and Fulgham made the motion and seconded, respectively.

The board then had to decide where they wanted to go for summer leadership training. The choices were either San Antonio from June 11-13, or Fort Worth from June 18-20. Last year the board went to Fort Worth, but this year they'll go to San Antonio.

On the 2008-2009 budget shortfall item, Caldwell said, "I'd like to have a meeting late January, early February, to get our best guess on what our options are. We need to do whatever we're going to do before we start hiring teachers."

No official action was taken on this at the time.

Caldwell also reported that the Rash/Barnes property acquisition was finally closed; the property now belongs to BISD. In addition, he recommended hiring Ana Bailey as a teacher for the 2008-2009 school year, effective retroactively for December 8.

Wise and Fulgham made the motion and seconded, respectively, to hire Bailey on a probationary contract.

The meeting was adjourned after the motion passed.

percent over the target goal for this month.

The revenues are at \$184,388.81, right on top of the target percentage.

For water and sewer expenditures, the balance is at 43.1 percent of the \$341,400 bud-

get, while the revenues are at 42.4 percent.

The council made a decision to put out bids on the sale of the old depot property.

Council Members Glen and Len Vest made the motion and seconded, respectively.
